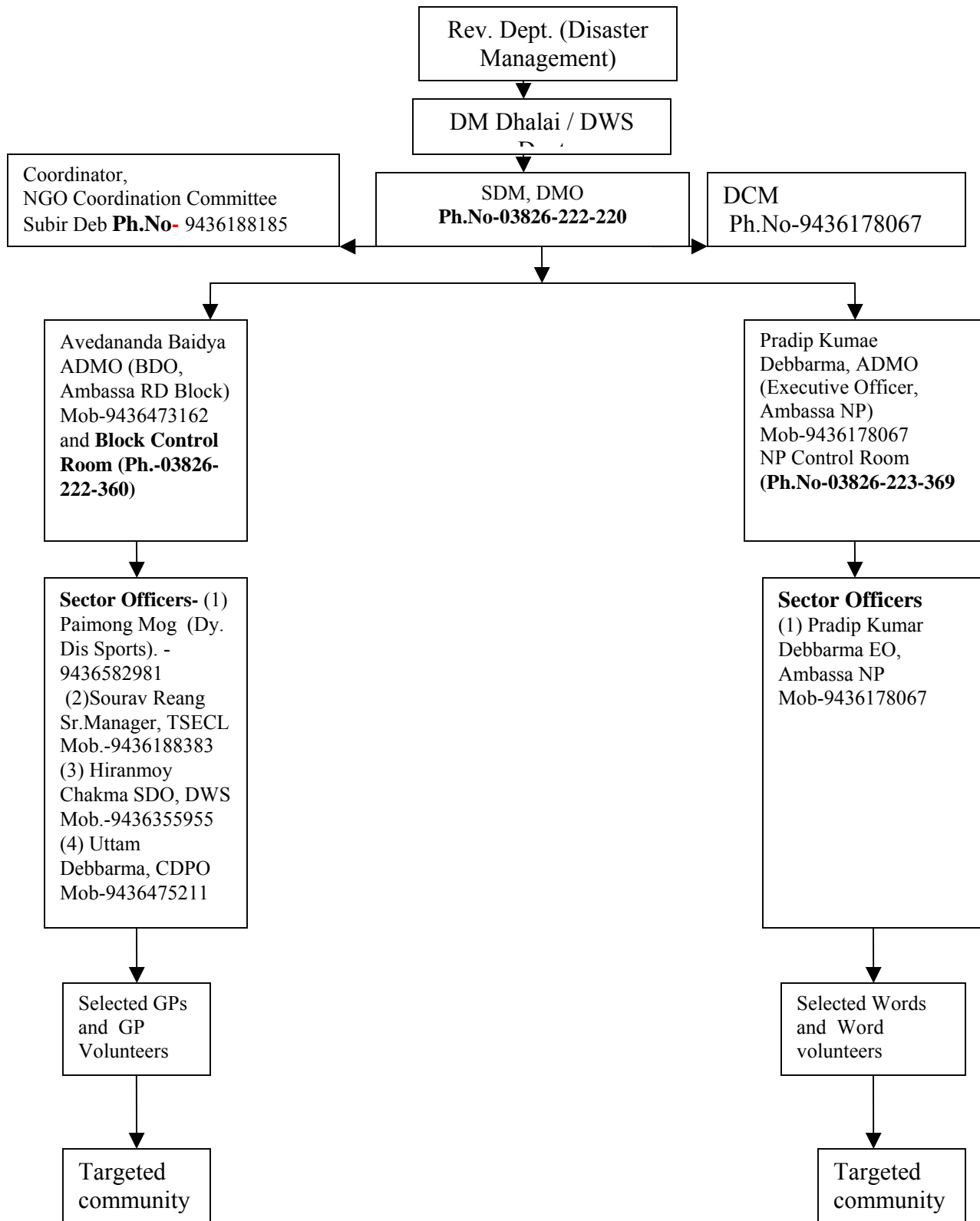

1.Introduction :-

Natural disasters have been one of the worst enemies of mankind since time immemorial, and various efforts have been made to control, mitigate, or manage them. Though none of these efforts have been fully successful. We have come to realize that natural disasters cannot be controlled, and hence our direction has to be towards managing them to the best of our advantage. One important point to be noted here is that though we cannot control natural disastrous phenomena, we can however, increase their fury with our actions, and this is what we have to avoid as part of our disaster management efforts.

In order to be able achieve all these objectives; the prime need is for collective action of the entire community, and for organizing such a movement. The only river namely 'Dhalai' is flowing towards north direction and her danger level is 67 meters.. Every year, it causes flood, which results adverse impacts in the community. Following areas are affected annually: -

(1) Houses and land damage / destroy due to erosion. (2) Household items damage / destroy (3) Loss of lives and injury (4) Livestock / cattle loss /death (5) Water born diseases (6) Transport problems (7) Livelihood problem (8) Crop field damage etc.

As we know, hazard is out of control. But if we increase our capacity, reducing vulnerability, we will be able to avoid disaster. This is why, a well planned Flood Management Plan is required for the Sub Division to reduce vulnerability and risk.

2.Flood in Ambassa Sub Division:

Ambassa Sub-Division is situated in between Longtharai and Atharamura hills under the periphery of Kamalpur, Longthari Vally Gangachara and Teliamura Sub-Divisions. Most of the revenue villages of this Sub-Division are situated at the hilly and low-lying areas and the compositions of soil of these areas are gravel mixed with loose sandy and red soil, which makes it prone to land sliding. Most of the villagers live in namely "TONG GHAR" (traditional dwelling house of tribal) build in the hilly areas. As to why a mild storm/cyclone /heavy rain can create loss of a vital part of public property. The only river namely 'Dhalai' is flowing towards north direction and her danger level is 67 meters.

There is a past history of Flood and damage of public properties as well as natural properties caused due to storm occurred in the year 2004 at Mashurai Para of Kulai R.F. V/C under Kulai Tehsil of Ambassa Sub-Division.

Each Flood causes 3 (three) types of situation such as- Erosion, Flash Flood and Gradual Flood.

Since no noticeable Flood has happened in the Sub-Division and no warning or forecasting received so far from any corner.

Reason : Heavy rain

Sufferings :This flood, affected in all sectors such as house damage, household item damage. Water born diseases also appeared.

Lesson learnt

Each flood is a nightmare for the people living in low land area or in extreme riverbank. There are Risk for (i) House damage, (ii) Documents damage / destroy (iii) Household items damage/ destroy (iv) Death/ missing (v) Problem with cattle (vi) Water born diseases (vii) problem with livelihood (viii) problem with vulnerable groups. (ix) Crop damage (x) Communication/ transport problem etc. So Identification of vulnerability, analysis of capacity and basing on them, preparedness and response measures should be undertaken before the flood season to reduce adverse impact of disasters. This bitter experience resulted us to prepare the present Sub Divisional level Disaster Response and Management Plan, where vulnerability and capacity has been identified through area visit, interaction with the affected families and preparedness and response measures has been adopted basing on the field experience and reports.

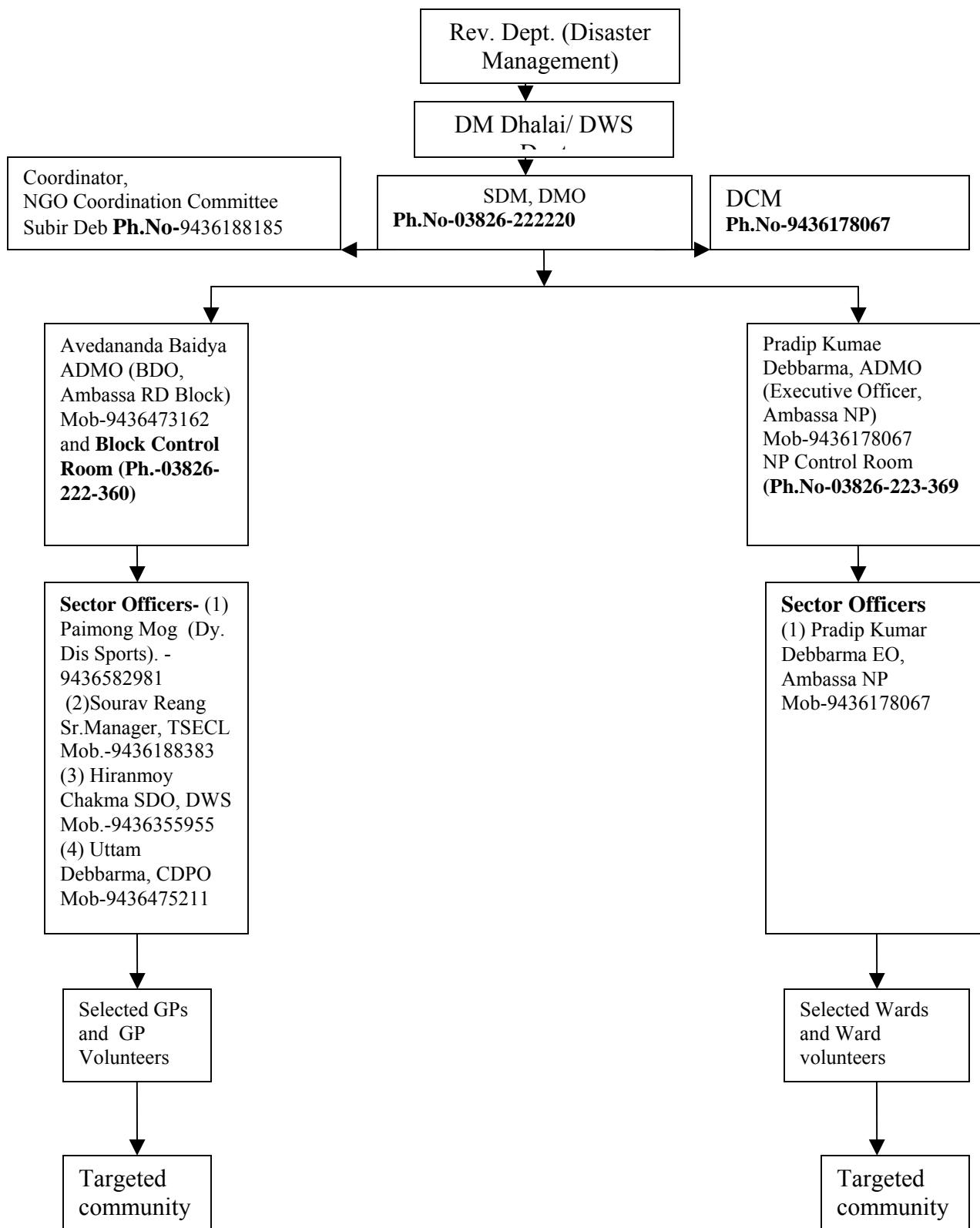

In charge of Hospital, Medical Officers would be requested to pre-position sufficient medicines at the vulnerable locations in the Sub Division. Along with life saving medicines, stocking of adequate water purifier and bleaching powder need to be ensured at the sub-division level.

Summary:-

The Ambassa Sub-Division was effected by flood during 1962, 1984, 1999, 2001,& 2004. The affected areas are mainly Kulai, Purba Nalichara, Paschim Balaram, Paschim Lalchari, Vivekananda Nagar, Shantipalli & TRTC Para. Flood Management Team has already been formed ; sectors formed and training of Sector officers/ Sector Assistants, PRI Secretaries/ GRS, GP level volunteers, members of NGO Coordination Committee done.A preparedness drill was also conducted on 31/05/2010 at Kulai Ghantachara Fishery Lake. Advance planning for combating the flood situation has been done. However disaster preparedness and risk mitigation is an ongoing exercise. Action plan for six months has been prepared to undertake comprehensive activities and also to combat disaster with more confidence , planning and preparation.
